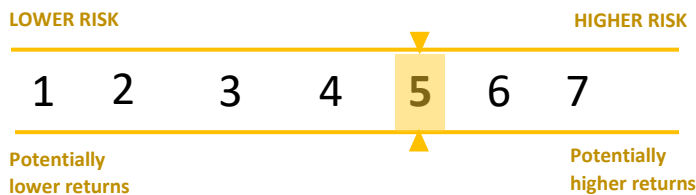
Description of this fund

The Fund provides an exposure to the New Zealand Property Market. The fund will invest in companies listed on the New Zealand stock exchange with significant exposures to the New Zealand property market.

What are the risks of investing?

Risk indicator for the New Zealand Property Fund¹:



The risk indicator is rated from 1 (low) to 7 (high). The rating reflects how much the value of the fund's assets goes up and down. A higher risk generally means higher potential returns over time, but more ups and downs along the way.

Example of how this applies to an investor:

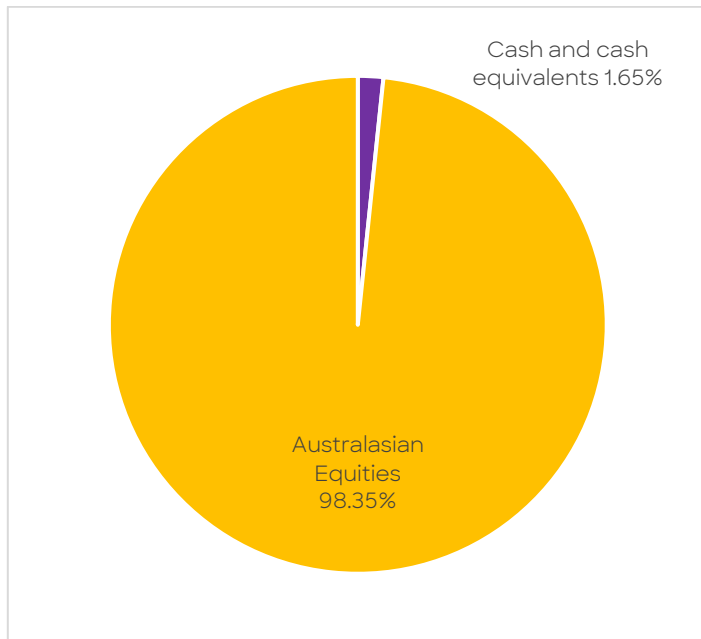
Small differences in fees and charges can have a big impact on your investment over the long term.

Lily had \$10,000 in the fund at the beginning of the year and did not make any further contributions. At the end of the year Lily incurred a loss after fund charges were deducted of \$584. (That is 5.84% of her initial \$10,000). Lily also paid \$30 in administration charges. This gives Lily a total loss after tax and charges of \$614 for the period.

Notes

1. As the fund started on 23 May 2022, actual returns for the fund are not available until then. To calculate the risk indicator for the five-year period ending 30 June 2023, market index returns have been used up to 23 May 2022, with actual fund returns used for the balance of the period. As a result of those market returns, the risk indicator may provide a less reliable indicator of the potential future volatility of the fund.
